11. A block containing the address 0x3514a5 is not contained in the cache. When loaded, which row (a through f) and column (0 through 3) will its value be stored in?

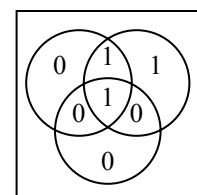
12. What is the main memory address of the data 0xff in the section of cache? Leave your answer in binary if you wish.

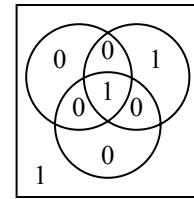
15. For the previous question, how many bits would the tag have if the mapping function were changed to 4-way set associative mapping?

24. True or false: Low-level formatting is used to set up the sectors and tracks and add identification and error checking to them.
25. True or false: Rotational Position Sensing increases a magnetic disk system's speed by increasing the density of data on tracks that are further from the center of the disk.
26. True or false: RAID 1 with its mirrored disks potentially reduces read times over RAID 0.
27. True or false: RAID 4 with its large strips and bit-by-bit parity stored on a parity disk has high parallel I/O request rates, but has very poor data transfer rates.
